Message from the Chair

Fall is always a busy time for GWS as we come back from our annual trip in August to the project sites with a laundry list of tasks to complete over the upcoming months.

The Summer 2016 Newsletter briefly touched on the trip activities, and there have been several outstanding efforts by members since then. One such effort has been members offering their time and expertise to the design and rehabilitation of an existing wastewater treatment plant in San Isidro. During the August trip, GWS visited this site to find it at full capacity and discharging water that was not adequately treated and inundated with algae. While maintaining full-time careers, GWS volunteers are working to bring this treatment system back to prime operating status and are actively communicating with vendors and local treatment plant operators to upgrade the existing lagoon system. San Isidro is one of few Costa Rican cities with a large-scale treatment system; therefore helping to ensure its success will inspire the industry to continue to grow in Costa Rica and will have a huge impact on the developing sanitation world.
